After completion of the player's current season, or April1, whichever shall last occur, a "try-out" period is designed to initiate the transfer process between teams in both Federations. An Incoming Team may avoid tampering charges/consequences, in either Federation, by completing and filing a Try-Out Notice prior to allowing the incoming player to try-out for a domestic team. The Try-Out Notice expires at midnight preceding the day of the incoming team's first regularly scheduled league game of the current season, as that schedule has been forwarded to and placed on file with the Team's National Federation, and no player can be placed on a Try-Out Notice after that date by any incoming team.

The Try-Out Notice must be signed by the incoming player, an official of the incoming team and forwarded to the incoming federation, who is responsible for insuring that the form is correctly completed. A Try-Out Notice shall be filed for each team whose camp a player attends. The incoming federation shall file the Try-Out Notice with the outgoing federation and the incoming player shall then be permitted to participate, on a try-out basis with the incoming team. Tryout Notices shall be filed with Hockey Canada and USA Hockey. Refer to the USAH/HC/CHL Transfer & Release Agreement for guidelines of player movement between the federations.
